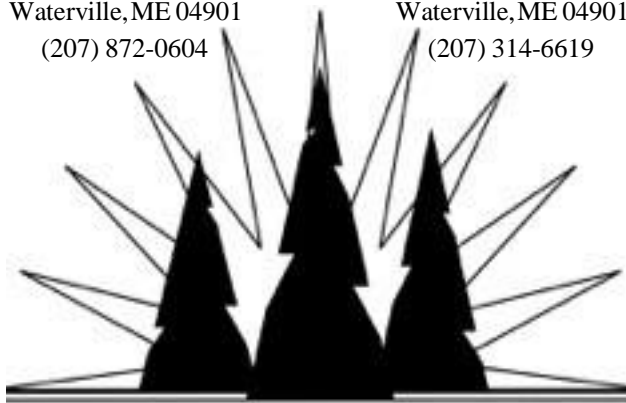
### **Please do not bring:**

### **Please bring:**

- Immunization & Tetanus Records
- Medications – IN ORIGINAL, PHARMACY ISSUED CONTAINER with label clearly indicating the name of the camper.
- Pillow
- Sleeping Bag
- Toiletries
- Towels
- Bible
- Snack Shack Money
- A set of Grub Clothes

A completed **MEDICAL HISTORY** form with **VACCINATION RECORD** attached and **SIGNED RELEASE STATEMENTS** are required for camp, These can be mailed in or brought to registration.

# LAKESIDE YOUTH CAMPS: Important Policies

**Medical Coverage:** We have a nurse/nurse practitioner who remains on the grounds throughout the week of camp; if the participant is not feeling well or is injured, the nurse/nurse practitioner will give immediate medical assistance. If the injury requires further attention, we will take the participant to Maine General Medical Center at which time we will contact the parent(s) or legal guardian(s).

## MEDICATIONS

- Lakeside considers "Medication" to be any substance a person takes to maintain, improve and/or alter their health. This includes over the counter drugs, vitamins & natural remedies.
- **Campers may not retain any medications in their possession, after registration.** This includes, basic vitamins, Advil, or anything else they may have permission to take regularly at home, without supervision. This is a legal issue and could result in dismissal from camp.
- **Lakeside can only accept medications in their original packaging.** In the case of prescriptions, they must be given to the nurse in their original pharmacy bottle, with the camper's name and instructions for taking the medication on the label.

## Leaving the Grounds

- If a child is removed from the campground (not accompanied by our nurse) for any medical reason, return to the camp program is contingent on parental transportation, a doctor's note and the approval of our medical staff.
- If Lakeside's nurse brings a camper off the grounds for treatment, the camper's parents will be contacted to determine if return to camp is the best course of action or not. If the nurse feels that we are unable to provide appropriate ongoing care for the injury, without compromising the ability to care for other campers, the injured camper's parents/guardians will be required to remove their camper.
- If a camper is diagnosed with a concussion they will not be allowed to return to camp.
- If a camper is required to leave camp, for medical or other reasons, Lakeside is not responsible for the reimbursement of lost days.
- Campers are not allowed to leave the grounds unless they have a significant reason, and it has been arranged with the director before the week of camp.

## OUTSIDE CONTACT

- **Camper safety is our top priority.** This means that we need to consider outside contact as a potential safety concern.
- **Campers will not be allowed to receive or make phone calls to any person not identified on their registration form.**
- **Campers are not allowed cell phones.** If they are found with one it will be taken from them until the end of the week.
- In accordance with general childcare policies (schools, daycare, and other camps) visitors are discouraged. If you feel you must visit your child during the week an appropriate time to do so should be arranged with the director beforehand.

## Dietary Restrictions

- Unfortunately, we are not always able to accommodate every dietary restriction.
- We will attempt to accommodate these needs, but we may need you supplement what camp is able to offer to ensure your camper has adequate nutrition for the entire week camp.
- **It is important that you reach out to your director as far ahead of camp as possible to ensure that appropriate arrangements can be made for your camper.**

## **This does not outline all of Lakeside's operational policies!**

These are major policies that we frequently have issues with or could result in someone being denied access to our program or being sent home.
